Loop Road NABA Count

Saturday July 23, 9 am - 5 pm \$3 fee

One of the most remote, secluded and peaceful places we visit is <u>Loop Road</u>, just west of Shark Valley, the <u>Oasis Visitor's Center</u> (for Big Cypress National Reserve), and the Jetport. This is one of the easiest counts, because we drive, stop, count unusual species, dive back into the air-conditioned car, cool down, and repeat the process.

Plan you visit: <u>Driving Guide</u>, <u>butterfly checklist</u>.

Meet at the eastern end of Loop Road at 9 am (if you pass 40-Mile Bend, you have gone too far).

Bring water, bug spray, snacks, and a bag lunch.
