Schaus' Swallowtail Butterfly Conservation on Northern Key

Speaker: Scott Tedford

Join us in Key Largo for our winter meeting in the Upper Keys. The spotlight will be on our Schaus' Swallowtail surveys conducted in April, May and June with Scott Tedford, This coordinated effort--with federal, state and county staff, the University of Florida and Miami Blue Chapter volunteers--helped prevent this rare butterfly from becoming extirpated. Plans are in the works to continue the surveys in 2017. Come learn how you can participate.

Florida State Parks I work with imperiled species, including shorebirds, sea turtles and the Florida scrub jay, on state park property from Fort Pierce down to Key West. I coordinate volunteers and compile data for the annual Schaus' swallowtail butterfly surveys on northern Key Largo and am a member of the Interagency Butterfly Working Group steering committee."

We will take a short walk to the Grove after the meeting to look for Silver-banded Hairstreaks.

As **there will be no refreshments** allowed in the meeting room, have an early lunch before you come. When you enter the park, identify yourself as a Miami Blue Chapter member. There will be no entrance fee for this meeting.
