SHARK VALLEY BUTTERFLY COUNT

Citizen scientists--join us for the annual counts. Every June/July NABA chapters throughout the U.S. census the butterflies in specific locations. The data is submitted to NABA, where it provides a cumulative record of butterfly abundance and scarcity.

Meet at the Everglades National Park Shark Valley entrance parking lot, on the south side of Tamiami Trail, opposite the Miccosukee Restaurant.

PINECREST (LOOP ROAD) BUTTERFLY COUNT
