Saturday, March 30 9 AM - 1 PM

Please join us for a cooler (than July) Shark Valley NABA count on Saturday, March 30, at 9 am. We will meet in the Visitors Center parking lot, then proceed walking along the beautiful canal front looking for butterflies not seen in other Miami-Dade County places.

We will also check the edges of US 41 going east as we head for head for home. I expect we will be finished by about 1 pm.

To get there, go west on US 41 (SW 8th Street) about 20 minutes west of Krome Avenue. The Everglades National Park Shark Valley entrance will be on your left (south), almost opposite the Miccosukee Restarurant on your right (north).

Schaus' Swallowtail butterfly monitors are needed on northern Key Largo. Dedicated volunteers will conduct surveys between mid-April and late June to find, count, and observe this endangered species.
